Camporee Information and Guidelines

- 1. Registration:** Your unit is registered when you have paid your fees by using the provided Registration Form in this Packet. You also need to complete a Camporee Unit Roster (keep copies for your records), a BSA Local Tour Permit (file the Local Tour Permit with Council and bring a copy to Camporee), and keep with you a copy of each person's Health History Form currently found on the Class 1 Personal Health and Medical Summary. **Registration fees are \$7.00 each for Scouts and Scouters and \$2.00 each for family members (under age 2 are free). List any special needs from your unit. Pre-registration will begin March 3, 2005 and continue until April 20, 2005.** Fees and registration are to be turned in to Dorinda Marks. Mrs. Marks can be reached at 878-9049 or by email at jrdoe@worldnet.att.net. Please make checks payable to Oconeechee Council, BSA. Give the required forms to the registrar upon arrival at the camp on Friday, May 6, 2005. (Make copies for your records.)

You can Register on Thursday, March 3, 2005, Thursday, April 7, 2005 at the District Roundtable meetings. **The Kia Kima District office will be open on Wednesday, April 13, 2005 from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. and Wednesday, April 20, 2005 from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. for registration.** We encourage you to register early.

NOTE: For a small fee, Crew 711 will be selling hot dogs, chips and a drink at the Dining Hall at Camp Bowers on Friday evening. Pre-orders are welcome and greatly appreciated. Please contact Deborah Wiggins at 424-6703 or Katrina Lagos at 487-4473.

- 2. Late Registration:** Beginning April 21, 2005, the fee to register will be \$9.00 each for both Scouts and Scouters. Fees and all registration forms must be completed and presented at the time of registration before your unit will be assigned or allowed to enter a campsite. Pre-registered units will be given their campsite assignments at the gate upon arrival. Boy Scout units arriving Friday who have not pre-registered must come to the Admin. Building at Camp Bowers and complete registration before being assigned a campsite. Cub Scout units arriving Friday who have not pre-registered must come to the Admin. Building on Camp McNeil and complete registration before being assigned a campsite. All registration forms must be completed and turned in by 11:00 p.m. on Friday, May 6, 2005.
- 3. FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
- 4. Check-In** will begin at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, May 6, 2005. **Absolutely no one will enter earlier!**
 - Upon arrival on Friday, pre-registered units will be directed to their campsites. All drivers must know what unit they belong to!
 - Please have someone from your unit return to the Admin. Building to complete the registration process.
 - Unit's trailers may be left in camp. **ALL OTHER** vehicles will be out of the campsites and parked in the appropriate parking lots by 11:00 p.m. Friday.

EXCEPTION: With prior written approval from the Camporee Chief, a unit with a special need recorded on the registration/medical form may keep one vehicle at the campsite. The permit issued by the Camporee Chief must be displayed in the windshield. The vehicle should have a state approved handicapped plate or placard.

5. **Campsites:** We will be observing the “Leave No Trace” principles during this Camporee. Some campsites have cabins on them. You are allowed to use the restroom facilities. You ARE NOT allowed to sleep in these cabins. If anyone is found to be sleeping in these cabins, a \$25.00 per night fee will be assessed.
6. **Vehicle Travel:** All vehicular travel will be one-way except for the Camporee staff to avoid traffic problems.
7. **Quiet Hours:** Everyone must be in his or her respective campsites between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. All are expected to be quiet. “A Scout is Courteous”. This is each unit leader’s responsibility.
8. **Health & Safety:** All safety precautions will be adhered to throughout the Camporee. The “Buddy System” is to be observed at all times. Report all unsafe conditions and actions to the Camporee Chief immediately. If the action is unsafe, stop the action. The unit leader’s tent will be marked for easy identification by staff at night.
9. **First Aid:** Scout leaders are to be prepared to handle all minor situations. Each unit is to have a First Aid Kit in their campsite. Serious injuries and emergencies must be reported immediately to the Admin. Building (Bowers for Scouts and McNeil for Cubs). There will be a trained Medical Technician present on site during the entire Camporee. Units having additional trained medical personnel present are asked to notify our Health and Safety Chairperson. The nearest full service hospital is Cape Fear Valley Medical Center in Fayetteville.
10. **Campfires:** Fire Pits are prohibited. All fires must be made within provided fire rings. Use ground fires only (if Camporee staff permits). Under no circumstances will any tree be cut down. Use extreme caution with all fires. Keep all fires at a reasonable size; never leave a fire unattended; and always provide adult supervision for all fires. Each unit must bring it’s own fire extinguishers. Plan cold meals in case of a fire ban. This also applies to Cub Scouts and Family Campers. **NOTE: Use of liquid fire starters is prohibited within the Boy Scouts of America.**
11. **Chemical Fuels:** Use of liquid fuel, propane, and butane in stoves and lanterns is permitted only with knowledgeable adult supervision. They must be kept in a secured location at all times.
12. **Campsite Inspection:** Campsites will be inspected. A member from each campsite will assist a campsite inspection team. Each patrol will be inspected and checked separately. The adult area will not be inspected.
13. **Gateways:** Must be lashed. No nails, screws, bolts, etc. Must be made of all natural materials and made on site. Use “Leave No Trace” principles. Camp gadgets made at camp will be recognized.
14. **Water:** Is available at each campsite and other sites throughout camp.
15. **Uniforms:** Class A uniforms are to be worn during Campfire and the Interfaith Service. Class B uniforms are to be worn at all other times. **Camouflage clothing is not permitted at any time for Scouts or Scouters.** Closed toe shoes must be worn at all times. No sandals or flip-flops.

16. Trading Post: Will be available at both camps.

17. Visitors: Visitors are welcome. They may observe all events, activities, visit unit campsites, and attend the Camporee Campfire. All visitors must leave the Camporee by 11:00 p.m. each night. All persons who stay overnight must be registered with a unit or Family Camping and pay Camporee fees. (All visitors must check in at the Admin. Building at Camp Bowers.)

18. Campfire Program:

- Cub Scouts 7:30 p.m. at the Arena (All skits must be approved by Bruce Mitchell or Shirley Battle.)
- Boy Scouts 8:30 p.m. at the Campfire Area (All skits must be approved by Debbie Wiggins or Marco Lagos.)

19. Worship Service: A Scout is reverent. An interfaith service will be held on Sunday morning at both camps at 8:30 a.m. For Cub Scouts, the Arena at Camp McNeil. For Boy Scouts, the Dining Hall at Camp Bowers. There will be NO movement of vehicles in camp until after the service is completed.

20. Trash/Garbage: Garbage is to be carried out. Dumpsters are available at the Camp exit.

21. Check-Out: Check-out forms and procedures will be given upon arrival. Per Camp Bowers/McNeil, a \$75.00 fee will be assessed for any campsites that are not cleaned up.

22. Alternate Plans: No plans have been made for rescheduling or canceling the Camporee. In case of extreme weather or major emergency, the Camporee Chief or the Professional Staff may cancel the Camporee. If the Camporee is to be cancelled, the Scout Shop will be notified. The local radio stations (Q98 & WKML) will also be notified. The County Sheriff or Professional Advisor will notify the Camporee Chief to start evacuation procedures (if needed). If there is a ban on open fires, all units need to plan for no-heat meals, use camp stoves properly. If there are more than 2 units per campsite, the units are expected to share shelters and other facilities and to clean them up.

23. PROHIBITED ITEMS: Fireworks, Firearms, Sheath Knives, Non-prescription drugs, and alcohol. Anyone bringing prohibited items will be required to leave immediately with forfeiture of all fees paid.

24. Pets: Absolutely NO pets allowed.

25. RULES VIOLATIONS: The Camporee Chief in consultation with the Camporee Staff will determine penalties for any violation of the rules.

26. Lost and Found: Lost and Found items are to be turned in to Headquarters (Admin. Building). These items will be displayed at Flag Raising/Flag Lowering and Assembly.

Take Grove Street (NC-24) to NC-53 E.

Bear right onto NC-53 E (NC-210 S) 6.7 miles

Continue onto NC-53 (Cedar Creek Rd.) 10.2 miles

Continue onto NC-53 (SR 53 W) 2.9 miles

You are at Camp Bowers/Camp McNeil (on your right)

Note: On Cedar Creek Road (NC-53) at the I-95 crossing, it is approximately 17.7 miles to Camp Bowers.
