Pat McCoy Order of the Arrow Advisor kept the OA busy all year long from participating in Troop elections, Camporees, OA Conferences, and LLD Training; to helping promote camping as well as many other activities to help Kia Kima District and the OA. The Lumbee Anilorac Chapter has brought home the "Spirit Award" many times and it shows in the way the youth and adults talk about their chapter. Pat has plans for her newly elected OA Officers to attend Lodge Leader Development and they are getting geared up for elections in January as well as planning a "Call Out" for the spring camporee.

Kay Stewart District Advancement Chairman has done an outstanding job this year. She has presided over more than 20 Eagle Boards of Review and has request for at least 5 more. Kay held a Life to Eagle Workshop at Friendship Baptist and is planning on hosting another one this Fall.
